
Vision:







Glo-Djigbé Industrial Zone (GDIZ)



- 19 cotton ginning plants installed across different regions, production areas to support local processing
- Approx. 728,000 tons of seed cotton is produced annually in Benin (FY 2020-21)





Attractive Investment Code

Customs Duties & Taxes

- **Exemption from all customs duties** and taxes while **importing** machinery equipment, raw materials, office supplies, and other capital goods
- Simplified procedure transferring imported goods to GDIZ

Tax System

- Exemption from all Taxes: Corporate Taxes, Dividend Taxes, Value Addition Taxes (VAT), Capital Gains Tax, Contribution on built and underdeveloped buildings/properties
- Refund of VAT credits within 30 days

Withholding Tax

100% exemption on the Withholding Tax on all Payments (Local & International)

Other Exemptions

100% exemption on Contract Registration / Transfer, Levies






